The Rite of Preparation is one example of intentions offered during the Divine Liturgy for a deceased person or for the Health and God's Blessings of a living person. These offerings are so powerful in that God's Grace continues to flow to the offeror and to the deceased or living intention. The Way of the Cross

As Catholic Christians we profess our dedication to Jesus Christ and His teachings, but so often we get distracted by the ways of this world. With the seasons of the Church, and the preparation of fasting and prayer that we practice, we are constantly reminded to refocus on the way of the cross.

In the Western Catholic Church, the way of the cross is another name for the stations of the cross. A prayer devotion that focuses on the passions of Jesus and walks with Him from His agony in the garden to His long suffering to His resurrection.

We traditionally do not have this devotion in the Eastern Catholic Church per se but we are encouraged to dedicate our life in constant understanding that we are to adopt Jesus' command that if we are to be called His people, calling ourselves Christians, that we are to "take up our cross and follow Him". The only way to do this is to understand His passions and suffering and to live His example of accepting the suffering for God's greater plan.

Through our family, career and social lives, we will encounter difficulties and suffering, challenges and struggles, pains and illness. These are only a few examples of "crosses" that Jesus spoke about. As Christians, we are called to not curse or complain about these as we encounter them, but rather to "take them up". Or in other words, to own them and work through them in faith that God will use them for His greater plan. With practice, many can actually get through them with joy in their heart and learn to offer up the suffering for causes close to God's heart. Some examples include the souls going through Purgation. Or for family members who may not be in the graces of the Church or receiving the sacraments. Or for penance for our own sins.

Even though it may be early in the new year, the Lenten season will be here before we know it. We encourage you to contemplate and pray that God bless you with a greater understanding of the way of His cross and to give you the courage and strength to truly follow Jesus as He calls us to do. What crosses do you have right now that you can embrace differently?
