Praying for vocations is a calling that has been asked for as far back as we can remember. But it is needed more than ever now.



This may be a neighbor, a classmate, a coworker, a family member, or even yourself. Don't be afraid to encourage them to consider the calling you may feel that may be on them. Words of affirmation may include something like this; "You have a lot of good qualities that would work well in the priesthood." Or. "Have you considered using your leadership and charismatic talents to serve the church as a priest?"

Your words may be the one push they were seeking to affirm their own feelings and draw that they may have deep in their heart. The decision to commit one's life to the church is a huge decision and needs a lot of confirmation and support.
