Halloween and the Byzantine Faith

Halloween, which is also called All Hallow's Eve or All Saint's Eve or All Souls Eve, is celebrated on October 31st. Right? Well, let's take a closer look.

For Roman Catholics, and other following secular calendars, the answer is "Yes". But in the Byzantine liturgical calendar, All Saints Day doesn't happen until the first Sunday after Pentecost. Are you ready for a second Halloween in late Spring? It can be a Byzantine Halloween.

Out of charity to our brothers and sisters in the Western Catholic Church, we can respectfully and personally observe the remembrance of our deceased loved ones November 1st and using October 31st to prepare for this remembrance. However, you will not find this celebration on our Eastern liturgical calendar.

Some great tips to prepare for remembering your loved ones include:

- If you have an icon corner in your home, take time to freshen it up.
- Gather up old broken rosaries, prayer beads (Chotki), old blessed pussy willows, flowers, foods, and prayer cards and bury them.
- Create a list of deceased loved ones and place it on your icon corner and remember to pray for them.
- Visit cemeteries of you loved ones and pray for their soul as well as other who do not have someone to pray for them.
- Pray for the souls in purgatory.

What about the little ones? Participating in the secular tradition of "trick or treating" actually has some its origins in the Catholic church where our Western brothers and sisters would go out and beg for cake on the eve of all souls. In various cultures in Europe they developed a tradition of "souling" and baking "soul cakes" in honor of the faithful departed. These cakes were baked on All Hallow's Eve (October 31) and children would go out on All Saints Day and All Souls Day, begging door-to-door for these cakes in exchange for praying for deceased relatives and friends.

Our children, and us, may also partake in this fun tradition in our modern times, but we should educate them with the real purpose of the tradition and the sacred day for the Western church. We should also avoid participating in the dark side that the secular world has carried into the tradition. Many church leaders over the ages warn about "dabbling in the demonic" as Satan is much more powerful than we typically give him credit for. Fun and innocent, or even "Saintly" costumes and decoration, are a much safer option. It may even be a cause to evangelize to other children and adults.
